INSTRUCTIONS FOR BMU SAT EXAMINATION FOR LAW ASPIRANTS

Read the following instructions carefully before you write the test :

1) The exam paper is divided into three sections :

Section A – Verbal Ability (**30 marks**)

Section B – Logical Reasoning (**30 marks**)

Section C – Essay (**40 marks**)

To be eligible for admission, a candidate needs to secure a minimum of **fifty percent(50%)** marks out of a total of hundred(**100**) marks.

2) Section A and Section B contain Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs) whereas Section C requires the candidate to write an essay.

In Section C, you are provided with three topics. You may choose to write an essay on any one of these questions.

You have ninety(90) minutes to finish the test. Kindly make judicious use of your time. While you are free to choose how you wish to spend your time among the sections, it is advised that you spend thirty minutes on each section.

Specific instructions regarding the essay question in Section C (Essay Question)

Read the following instructions carefully : -

Write an essay on **any one** of the three topics provided below:

- 1) *Topic 1*
- 2) *Topic 2*
- 3) *Topic 3*

Your essay shall be evaluated based on the evidence it provides of your ability to :

- 1) State and develop your original thought/perspective on the topic.
- 2) Clearly and logically organise your ideas in an essay.
- 3) Reflect critically on the topic i.e. your ability to support your answer with proper reasoning.
- 4) Effectively communicate your ideas in plain English.
- 5) Avoid any spelling or grammatical mistakes.

There are no prescribed word limits or word ranges. However, you are expected to write around **250-300 words**.

Please note that if the essay is found to be plagiarised, it shall lead to disqualification of the candidate
