WHAT IS LIBERAL STUDIES?

A Liberal Studies education prepares students to venture in a rapidly changing world by liberating the mind from the bondage of habits, customs, dogma and prejudice. The primary objective of a Liberal Studies education is to train students to think critically, creatively, and ethically about the world and themselves to be active citizens, leaders, and compassionate human beings. The most pressing issues of our time—climate change, artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, social inequality, public health, urban growth, rural development—cannot be addressed by any one discipline alone. With the disciplinary rigor at its core, the Liberal Studies program adopts an interdisciplinary foundation that equips students to integrate concepts, methods, and thoughts across the natural sciences, social sciences, arts, and humanities. This exchange becomes the fertile ground of generating and juxtaposing new concepts, methods and innovative solutions to complex challenges. The emphasis on depth and breadth prepares graduates to systematically approach real-world problems from multiple perspectives to tease out the nuances of the problems and possible solutions. The emphasis on writing and communication subsequently enables them to communicate their ideas effectively to diverse audiences. Liberal Studies education opens up a space to understand different worlds in a collaborative manner and transforms students into lifelong learners.



SCHOOL OF LIBERAL STUDIES

The School of Liberal Studies (SoLS) at BMU offers a four-year B.A. (Hons) degree with a third-year exit option. Our program aligns with the NEP 2023 as it focuses on interdisciplinary education, flexibility in subject choice, research orientation, practical training and internship. In our programme, students are expected to curate their academic path in consultation with their faculty mentors to choose a major that makes sense for their professional, personal, and civic goals. In the first three semesters students will complete required foundational courses while exploring their intellectual interests through introductory disciplinary courses. This offers them the necessary exposure to choose the major/minor in the middle of second year. Their second and third years will be devoted to completing the required credits for their selected major and minor, while their fourth and final year will focus on individual research, internships, and vocational training.

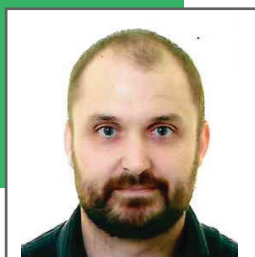

Students can also choose to do a double major degree. A student has to secure a minimum of 40% credits from the second major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a double major.

THE BMU DIFFERENCE

The Liberal Studies programme at BMU nurtures students to unpack problems in an in-depth manner, and understands social-economic and ecological issues in their complex web of networks that will guide them in their personal and professional pursuits.

Inquiry-Immerse-Impact Pedagogy

A core component of education has always been dialogic transactions between the teacher and the student in the confines of a classroom. The multi-faceted challenges of the world, however, demand learning in a frame that can go beyond the classroom. The most important social, economic, political or ecological questions of our times require a deeper engagement with the field of study. Learning from human society and nature through an immersive pedagogy is crucial not only for a better understanding of these issues but also for imagining and executing transformative actions. Such an engagement also allows the co-creation of knowledge by students, teachers, and various communities within the larger society. This accesses various formal and informal repositories of knowledge that exists within nature, communities and social structures and uses them for participative, fair, and transformative solutions.

In an immersive learning and inquiry, knowledge creation itself integrates with the subjects of study and therefore directly engages with the ethical aspects of research. The School of Liberal Studies envisions learning as a blend of dialogic transactions and immersive pedagogies, that integrate high theories with the lived realities of human beings. The BA Liberal Arts programme offers a choice of interdisciplinary minors around the themes of child and youth studies, human ecology, data and measurement, among others. A substantial part of these minors are transacted as part of a field-immersion module.

As a part of immersive pedagogy and interdisciplinary education we also offer

- a. A practice-oriented fourth-year that prepares students for either professional placements or further studies.
- b. An authentic interdisciplinarity not limited to social and natural sciences, but extending to the professional disciplines. Students in our program will be able to take advantage of course offerings from BMU's three professional schools: Management, Law, Engineering and Technology.

Student Centric Approach

SoLS curricular design and pedagogy embraces a Student centric approach. We acknowledge that learners in any classroom learn at different pace with different styles, they have different abilities & inclinations and according to their prior- experiences these may greatly vary. We offer diverse learning materials starting from text to audio-visual, creative experiments and immersive experience. Our classroom creates a democratic space where peer-learning becomes the core. We have a high teacher-student ratio and a small classroom setup that encourages learning together by questioning, listening, and thinking critically.

Inclusion and Diversity

To offer an equal opportunity to every students, to acknowledge the effort of meritorious student those are in need, to encourage students with diverse strengths, and to foster cultural diversity and inclusion we offer generous need-based and merit-based scholarships and financial aid.



ADMISSION PROCESS

Stage 1

Application stage: Students apply through the application portal with their Grade X and Grade XII (if available) marks along with details of co and extra curricular activities.

Stage 2

Online test stage: Shortlisted students are invited to undertake an online verbal ability test along with an Essay writing and a Visual Analysis test. The essay will be evaluated based on the student's ability to logically and coherently organise an argument with relevant facts and evidence, develop and present a narrative and bring in multiple perspectives wherever applicable. In the Visual Analysis test, students will be asked to write a caption describing and/or commenting on an image.

Stage 3

Interactive stage: Based on the performance in the online test stage, students will be invited to have an interaction with the SoLS faculties. Offer will be made following this stage.
